4. Description of the proposed works

Leechwell Holy Well Totnes (Scheduled Ancient Monument, List Entry No 1020170, UID 43875, Grid Reference SX 80024 60175)

Totnes Town Council and the Leechwell Garden Association (LGA) are applying for Scheduled Monument Consent to:

- Re-puddle the inner chamber of the Leechwell (last done in 1996)
- Clear away plant growth from the outer walls of the Well and repair if necessary
- Erect a new information board to replace that lost sometime after 1950

The Leechwell is a much-visited site in Totnes but at the moment it is looking very neglected. Water is seeping away through the floor of the inner chamber, radically reducing the water supply feeding the outer troughs. The outer basin is silted up and clogged with weeds. Ivy and other foliage is growing on the outer walls. This will be cleared and re-pointed if necessary.


Ideally, the inner chamber of the well (behind the retaining wall and grill) should be re-puddled every 5-10 years. The clay lining supports the inner water level, directing the water out through pipes in the retaining wall where it falls into three granite troughs in the outer chamber. We present a comprehensive Schedule of Works for bringing the Leechwell back to its traditional level of functioning.

Various signs have been put up in the well over the years. The wording is known for at least one. Drawing upon this and a consensus of available knowledge, a new sign is proposed. It will be placed on a side wall where it does not dominate the eye and high enough to deter the casual graffiti which sometimes appears in this area.


Totnes Town Council and the LGA are collaborating to repair the Well. Ownership of the *outer well chamber* cannot be established, but, by historic precedent, it has always been cared for by the town council. The *inner well chamber* lies beneath the garden of Westhill House and is owned by Hester Pelley (see Par 2(1)(b). The LGA are responsible for the Scheduled Immersion Pool in the Leechwell Garden, which is fed by water from the Well, and were asked by English Heritage to co-ordinate this application.


The text on the large white board read as follows:

"Wardens of the Lychewylle were appointed in the Middle Ages and the names of wardens between 1405 and 1475 are known. The water that feeds the troughs was believed to have healing properties. The three troughs were known locally as Snake, Toad and Long Crippler (Grass Snake) and purported to alleviate eye and skin diseases and snake bites".

In addition the large white and the black board also carried the town crest. There may have also been another board (now lost) at the well which read:

"In 1405 the Town Council appointed two wardens of the Leechwell, Hugo Welwode and Waltens Nyatt. The office of Warden of the Leechwell continues to the present day".

5.5 New sign showing its proposed location



The new information board will have gold lettering on a black background and will be approximately 67cm x 47 cm in size.

It will be positioned on the right-hand side wall where it does not dominate the eye and placed high enough to deter casual graffiti.

5.6 Design and text of new sign

The Leechwell

A water source of this name has been recorded here since the 13th Century.

Wardens were appointed to ensure its care and the names of wardens between 1405 and 1475 are known. This office still exists today.

The three troughs are known locally as Snake, Long Crippler and Toad and it was believed that the water had healing qualities for snake-bite, joints, eyes and skin diseases.

Scheduled as an Ancient Monument by English Heritage in 2002.

6. Any other information relevant to the application

Ownership of the Leechwell can only identified for the *inner well chamber* (see + marked Leechwell on document 5.2) which lies beneath the garden of 10 Leechwell Street (Westhill House). This document *specifically excludes the outer well area*. Despite intensive searches, ownership of the outer area cannot be traced beyond 1889. However, by historic precedent, Totnes Town Council have appointed Wardens for the well and taken responsibility for its upkeep- it was last repaired by them in 1996. It is on this basis that this application is made.
